Proposal to celebrate the World Human Rights Day

Introduction:

World Human Rights Day is a significant date for all countries and people worldwide. We would like to work to spread the knowledge of human rights among those people who never heard or never paid attention on human rights and to focus on helping our learners (adults) to learn about their human rights and to let them know that a celebration human right day exists. Our goal is to let people known the importance for everybody to respect the human rights as a duty for all human being.

Objectives of the celebration:

1. To share the event through human rights documentaries.
2. To be able to listen the subject matter in another language.
3. To promote and advertise the World Human Rights Day.
4. To ensure our learners to be actively involved in the celebration day and to be themselves actors of that day

Target groups:

This proposal is addressed to: Learners of the Adult Education Centres, Green Peace, Unicef, Amnesty international and other organizations dealing with human rights.

Preparatory activities, prior to the celebration

During the preparatory meeting we settled to celebrate world human right day organizing an event for our learners and all organizations whose target group is made up of adults. The main tool to use for such event is music with e special regard to those folk songs facing the theme against racism and human rights violation collected in the universal declaration of human rights after 1848-2008.

Learners will do researches to find out which songs can be suitable for such event.

They will learn the songs and they will prepare a performance.



They will also work in finding a documentary on the Universal declaration of human rights in order to open a debate among the participants as well as to organize text messages campaign encouraging people to read and know the Universal Declaration.

Activities proposed for the celebration programme (with references to the document Inventory of creative strategies):

Strategy 19: Choose music according to the special day to represent the subject, organize a concert

Strategy 12, 16: Asking learners to do searches for tales, and their knowledge on human rights and share them in class.

Strategy 9: listen the songs and analyze the meaning of the words and relate them to the subject. Write new words make significant sentences, and organize a text message campaign encouraging people to read and know the Universal Declaration. Elaboration of a glossary between positive and negative words related to human rights.

Strategy 22: Learners express their feeling about the celebration day in handicrafts (paints, decoupage, hand made banners, and they will show them during the celebration day established.
